

So, on September 7th my sponsor rolled into my driveway to pick me up for this new service adventure. Off we drove, chatting cheerfully on our drive north. I was looking forward to meeting our trusted servants from the A.A. General Service Office (GSO in New York City) and mingling with members in service from all over the Pacific Region. My sponsor (whom I will now refer to as S.P.; short for "Sponsor Person") planned on catching up with friends still living in the town where she got sober. The side benefit was spending time with each other as friends and sisters in sobriety. It was a good plan, and we pulled it off without a hitch!

The Pacific Region consists of 9 states; Alaska, Washington, Oregon, Idaho, California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona and Hawaii. There are 8 regions in the U.S. and Canada, and 4 regional forums per year. This works out to each region having a forum every other year. Our next one will be in Las Vegas in 2020. I found it fascinating to hear how members in Hawaii and Alaska stay in touch within their service areas given such geological challenges as Alaska's vast unpopulated spaces and Hawaii's island hops via air or water. Technology is beginning to be utilized to this end. It's just so cool to meet these brothers and sisters; so different yet so alike. The feeling that we're all working together to carry the message is powerful for this alcoholic!

There was a special meeting for first time attendees (we were the most important people in the rooms), which was the first thing on the agenda. Unfortunately, I missed it, but on the other hand, I had an inspiring dinner with S.P. and her San Jose service friend whom I shall call S.J. Throughout dinner we shared our stories about what it was like, what happened and mostly what it's like now. During the next 2 days S.J. introduced us to local A.A. members and played the gracious host. I am so grateful to **get to** make connections like this!

One of the highlights of the Forum was finding out that the translation of the Big Book into the Navajo language had been completed after years of work and several setbacks. Navajo is a spoken language, so the Big Book was translated as audio only. The Native American alcoholics are very grateful to the fellowship for completing this most important work. They feel it will help keep their language and culture alive. Our dollars in the baskets of our meetings enable this far reaching type of work to be done!

Old Timer's Prayer

Higher Power keep me from thinking I must share in every meeting, no matter the topic. Keep my mind free from the recital of endless details and give me wings to get to the point. Remind me to guard confidences and to keep still when I feel it is necessary to speak up "for someone's own good."

Release me from the need to straighten out everybody else's thinking and program. Higher Power, I ask for the grace to listen to newcomers. Please help me to remember the patience with which others listened to me when I was new.

Please seal my lips to giving advice and help me to remember to share only my experience, strength, and hope.

Remind me that my purpose is to fit myself to be of maximum service to you and to the people around me. Help me to remain teachable. Teach me (again) the lesson that, occasionally, it is possible that I may be wrong; and remind me, please, of the freedom that I gain when I am able to promptly admit I'm wrong and make amends where necessary.

Help me to remember the difference between making amends and just saying, "I'm sorry." Help me to be a worker among workers, a friend among friends. Please keep me from being a bleeding deacon and help me to walk the path towards being an elder states(wo)man. Keep me ever mindful that I cannot manage my own life through my own unaided will. I know that I am not a saint; please show me the way to seek you so that I may continue to grow along spiritual lines.

Remind me, please, of "Rule 62"-to not take myself so damn seriously. (It is so easy to take myself way too seriously.) Keep me free of gossip, character assassination, and judgment. Remind me thatbecause I am not perfect-although I have humbly asked, my character defects and shortcomings still arise unexpectedly, to cause damage to others and to myself.

Help me to walk with faith and acceptance, to see good things in unexpected places and talents in unexpected people, and give me the grace to tell them so.

Help me to see that you love each of us, and that you do not need my opinion of them or suggestions on what they might deserve.
