As we Zoom the Road of Happy Destiny

On the weekend of March 13 – 15, a group of sober alcoholics gathered to move Central Office from San Luis Obispo to a new office in Los Osos. As we prepared to open the new office the next week, the state Shelter at Home orders went into effect. At the same time, almost all of our meeting locations were shuttered. When our meeting locations shut down, the lifelines for our recoveries were cut; we alcoholics all depend on hearing and sharing our message with one another.

Around the world, alcoholics sprang into action and started opening up new electronic portals whereby AA groups could continue to meet and share their stories. And the Central Coast Central Office Intergroup team was part of that movement. Within a week, we had about 50 "remote" meetings listed and alcoholics started learning how to navigate through the various screens, set up meeting rooms, and take precautions to negate the Zoom "bombers". A few weeks later, we had over 100 meetings listed for our district and the CCCOI website traffic increased dramatically.

This is a unique time in history, as well as our fellowship due to the COVID-19 shutdowns. As you all know, our International Convention, scheduled for Detroit in early July, has been canceled. But I can tell you that it is being celebrated every day via cyberspace. There are thousands of remote meetings held daily around the world, with attendees from diverse parts of the globe.

You can find English-speaking meetings easily using any of the web search engines. I compiled a list of about 30 countries and distributed that list to my home group; our "Zoomsters" club drops in on one or two meetings a day. To date, I have attended meetings in 24 countries and did so on 6 continents in two days. Here are some of the unique God-shots I gathered along the way:

- I met an Irish lady from Portland, Oregon in a meeting in Majorca, Spain who had just attended a meeting in Dublin, Ireland where she met her drug counselor from 12 years ago.
- I joined a Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam meeting last week where it was just the meeting leader/host and

me; "Any two or three alcoholics gathered together may call"

- In The Hague, Holland, I met two sober alcoholics from Maryland who had just finished attending meetings in all 50 states.
- The "Midnight Sun" Reykjavik, Iceland meeting meets 6 days a week; they just resumed 2 face-to-face meetings whereby they also conference in Zoom participants around the globe.
- Down in Aruba, I met a new sober friend who lives next door to one of my best friends from that island.
- The Bondi Beach, Australia meeting was "packed" with 62 attendees, some from Ireland, Scotland, Chicago, New York and Tasmania.
- In a Buenos Aires, Argentina meeting, I met a Peruvian alcoholic who got sober at the Radford Group in North Hollywood, where he had the opportunity to meet Dr Paul O.
- At my Glasgow, Scotland meeting, we had a newcomer drop in from Casablanca, Morocco.
- My home group here in Los Osos has a Sunday 7am speaker meeting; so far, we have had speakers from the Yellowwood AA group in South Africa and Chiang Mai, Thailand. On deck, we have speakers coming from The Hague, Holland, and an AA/Al-Anon couple from South Africa.

What's next? No one knows for sure, but I would bet that these new communication pathways will not just disappear. I can't wait to get back to my meeting hall and see my "peeps" again. If all the restrictions were lifted on the first meeting day, I would predict that we would never get the meeting started - too much time for hugs and handshakes. But I hope that we can continue reaching out to alcoholics around the world via the web; the beauty of it is that you hear the same AA sayings no matter where you go, the only difference is in the accent. If you haven't ventured out to meet our sober brothers and sisters around the world – give it a try. I guarantee it will bring you happiness, joyfulness and freedom.


